**Subject:** Authorize an Intermunicipal Agreement with the Rochester City School District for Administrative and Education Liaison Services

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body authorize an intermunicipal agreement with the Rochester City School District ("RCSD") in an amount not to exceed \$170,000 for administrative and education liaison services with Raise the Age youth for the period of April 1, 2024 through March 31, 2025, with the option to renew for four (4) additional one-year terms in an amount not to exceed \$170,000 per year.

Raise the Age legislation was enacted with a number of objectives. It aims to reduce crime victimization; provide meaningful opportunity for a life without the stigma of a criminal record for adolescents who turn away from crime; eliminate the disproportionate incarceration of 16- and 17-year-olds of color in adult jails and prisons; reserve the juvenile placement system for only those young people who present a risk to public safety; and create therapeutic out-of-home placement settings for young people who do not present a risk to public safety.

This intermunicipal agreement with the Rochester City School District will provide an Administrative Specialist/Educational Liaison who will work on behalf of Raise the Age youth to facilitate re-entry into school or other educational programming.

**The specific legislative action required is to authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to execute an intermunicipal agreement and any amendments thereto, with the Rochester City School District for administrative and education liaison services with Raise the Age youth in an amount not to exceed \$170,000 for the period of April 1, 2024 through March 31, 2025, with the option to renew for four (4) additional one-year terms in an amount not to exceed \$170,000 per year.**

This action is a Type II Action pursuant to 6 NYCRR § 617.5(c)(26) ("routine or continuing agency administration and management, not included new programs or major reordering of priorities that may affect the environment") and is not subject to further review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act.

Funding for this contract is included in the 2024 operating budget of the Department of Public Safety, general fund 9300, funds center 2403020100, Juvenile Services Family Division. No additional net County support is required in the current Monroe County budget.

**Subject:** Amend Resolution 103 of 2024 to Accept Additional Funding from the United States Department of Justice, United States Marshals Service Western District of New York for the United States Marshals Service NY/NJ Regional Fugitive Task Force-Rochester Division

Honorable Legislators:

This matter is being referred to Your Honorable Body at the request of Sheriff Todd K. Baxter.

I recommend that Your Honorable Body amend Resolution 103 of 2024 to accept additional funding from the United States Department of Justice, United States Marshals Service ("USMS") Western District of New York for the United States Marshals Service NY/NJ Regional Fugitive Task Force-Rochester Division in the amount of \$8,000 for the reimbursement of overtime for the period of October 2, 2023 through September 30, 2024.

This grant continues to support the collaborative task force with the USMS to investigate, apprehend, and arrest violent felony fugitives. The grant will reimburse a portion of the overtime costs associated with the task force services. This is the fourteenth year the county has received this grant. This additional funding will bring the grant total to \$43,000.

**The specific legislative actions required are:**

1. Amend Resolution 103 of 2024 to accept an additional \$8,000 from, and to authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to execute a contract and any amendments thereto, with the United States Department of Justice, United States Marshals Service Western District of New York for the United States Marshals Service NY/NJ Regional Fugitive Task Force-Rochester Division for the reimbursement of overtime for the period of October 2, 2023 through September 30, 2024.

2. Amend the 2024 operating budget of the Office of the Sheriff by appropriating the sum of \$8,000 into general fund 9300, funds center 3803010000, Police Bureau Administration.

This action is a Type II Action pursuant to 6 NYCRR § 617.5(c)(26) (“routine or continuing agency administration and management, not including new programs or major reordering of priorities that may affect the environment”) and is not subject to further review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act

This grant is 100% funded by the United States Department of Justice, United States Marshals Service Western District of New York. No net County support is required in the current Monroe County budget.

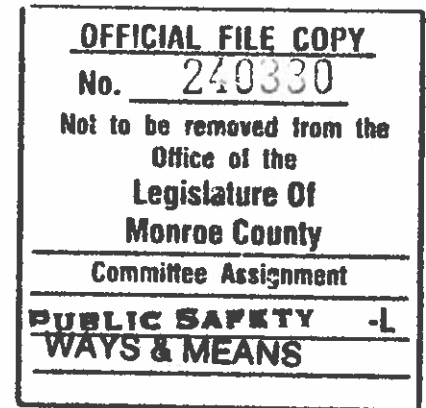

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body authorize a contract with Hagerty Consulting, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$149,877 for Emergency Management Family Assistance Center and Family Reunification Center Plans for the period of December 1, 2024 through December 31, 2026.

Hagerty Consulting, Inc. will assess existing plans, protocols, and resources related to family assistance and reunification and develop Family Assistance Center and Family Reunification Center plan(s), stakeholder training, and tabletop exercises.

A Request for Proposals was issued for Emergency Management Family Assistance Center and Family Reunification Center Plans, with Hagerty Consulting, Inc. was selected as the most qualified to provide these services.

**The specific legislative action required is** to authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to execute a contract, and any amendments thereto, with Hagerty Consulting, Inc., 1618 Orrington Avenue, Suite 201, Evanston, Illinois 60201, for Emergency Management Family Assistance Center and Family Reunification Center Plans in an amount not to exceed \$149,877 for the period of December 1, 2024 through December 31, 2026.

This action is a Type II Action pursuant to 6 NYCRR § 617.5(c)(24) (“information collection including basic data collection and research, water quality and pollution studies, traffic counts, engineering studies, surveys, subsurface investigations and soils studies that do not commit the agency to undertake, fund or approve any Type I or Unlisted action”) and (27) (“conducting concurrent environmental, engineering, economic, feasibility and other studies and preliminary planning and budgetary processes necessary to the formulation of a proposal for action, provided those activities do not commit the agency to commence, engage in or approve such action”) and is not subject to further review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act.

Funding for this contract is included in the 2024 operating budget of the Department of Public Safety, general fund 9301, funds center 2408030100, Office of Emergency Management, and will be requested in future years budgets. 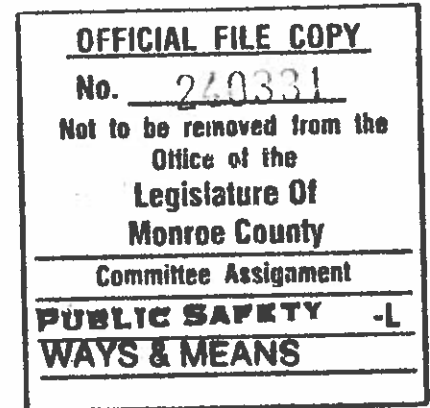

Subject: Authorize a Contract with Youth Advocate Programs, Inc. for Intensive Services for Justice Involved Youth

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body authorize a contract with Youth Advocate Programs, Inc. ("YAP") in an amount not to exceed \$400,000 for intensive services for Justice Involved Youth for the period of April 1, 2024 through March 31, 2025, with the option to renew for four (4) additional one-year terms in an amount not to exceed \$400,000 per year.

YAP will serve at risk and system involved youth by providing intensive, personalized, and unconditional support through a community-based Wraparound Advocacy Model that comprehensive, trauma informed and based upon best practices found in wraparound, mentoring, restorative justice and positive youth development fields. YAP utilizes Evidence Based practices which include Strength-based practice, Wraparound, Family Group Conferencing, Positive Youth Development, and Mentoring. YAP has maintained accreditation from the Council on Accreditation since 2009. YAP has a "no-reject-no eject" policy that ensures all youth referred will be served.

A Request for Proposals was issued for this contract with Youth Advocate Programs, Inc. selected the most qualified to perform these services.

**The specific legislative action required is to authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to execute a contract, and any amendments thereto, with Youth Advocate Programs, Inc., 3899 North Front Street, Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, for intensive services for Justice Involved Youth in an amount not to exceed \$400,000 for the period of April 1, 2024 through March 31, 2025, with the option to renew for four (4) additional one-year terms in an amount not to exceed \$400,000 per year.**

**Subject:** Authorize a Contract with Family Counseling Service of the Finger Lakes, Inc. for Problematic Sexual Behavior Treatment Services

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body authorize a contract with Family Counseling Service of the Finger Lakes, Inc. ("FCSFL") in an amount not to exceed \$100,000 for problematic sexual behavior treatment services for the period of April 1, 2024 through March 31, 2025, with the option to renew for four (4) additional one-year terms in an amount not to exceed \$100,000 per year.

Family Counseling Service of the Finger Lakes, Inc. will provide child and adolescent sexual abuse assessment and treatment services using a variety of therapeutic modalities to address trauma, abuse, and/or loss, as well as provide therapeutic treatment for acute and ongoing mental health concerns, substance abuse, relational concernsm and other life challenges. Assessment and treatment services will be provided by a master's-level therapist trained in problematic sexual behaviors-specific modalities.

A request for proposals was issued for this contract, and Family Counseling Service of the Finger Lakes, Inc. was selected as the most qualified to provide these services.

**The specific legislative action required is to authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to execute a contract and any amendments thereto, with Family Counseling Service of the Finger Lakes, Inc., 671 South Exchange Street, Geneva, New York 14456-3414, for problematic sexual behavior treatment services in an amount not to exceed \$100,000 for the period of April 1, 2024 through March 31, 2025, with the option to renew for four (4) additional one-year terms in an amount not to exceed \$100,000 per year.**



**Subject:** Authorize a Contract with Partners in Restorative Initiatives for Restorative Practices Services for Justice Involved Youth

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body authorize a contract with Partners in Restorative Initiatives, Inc. ("PIRI") in an amount not to exceed \$40,000 for restorative practices services for Justice Involved Youth for the period of April 1, 2024 through March 31, 2025, with the option to renew for four (4) additional one-year terms in an amount not to exceed \$40,000 per year.

Partners in Restorative Initiatives will provide mediation services and restorative interventions to Justice Involved Youth and their families. These services will offer youth, who are alleged or have been charged with a crime, the opportunity to repair the harm they have created by their alleged actions. Youth will engage in restorative conferences to address the harm and then identify an agreement regarding actions to repair the harm. Cognitive Behavioral Intervention workshop series for youth, Parenting Circles, and mediation and family circles will also be offered.

A request for proposals was issued for this contract, and Partners in Restorative Initiatives was selected as the most qualified to provide these services.

**The specific legislative action required is to authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to execute a contract and any amendments thereto, with Partners in Restorative Initiatives, 111 Hillside Avenue, Rochester, New York 14610-2407, for restorative practices services for Justice Involved Youth in an amount not to exceed \$40,000 for the period April 1, 2024 through March 31, 2025, with the option to renew for four (4) additional one-year terms in an amount not to exceed \$40,000 per year.**



**Subject:** Acceptance of a Grant from the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services for the County Reentry Task Force Program and Authorize a Contract with Delphi Drug and Alcohol Council, Inc.

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body accept a grant from the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services in the amount of \$795,720 and authorize a contract with Delphi Drug and Alcohol Council, Inc. ("Delphi") in the amount of \$784,500 for the County Reentry Task Force Program for the period of October 1, 2024 through September 30, 2025.

The County Reentry Task Force ("Task Force"), which is co-chaired by the County's Deputy Chief Probation Officer and includes members from over 40 local law enforcement agencies and human services providers, has a goal of reducing recidivism through improved coordination among criminal justice, social services, educational, health, and mental health systems. The Task Force is addressing the following four reintegration issues of parolees: basic education, employment, sobriety support, and housing. This grant will fund a contract with Delphi for a Local Reentry Coordinator and the provision of services related to these reintegration issues. This is the nineteenth year of grant funding for this program. This year's funding is the same amount as last year.

Delphi is a community-based behavioral health agency serving the Finger Lakes community. Delphi provides a drug and alcohol outpatient program, two domestic violence programs, and case management to clients in specialized courts and Health Home initiatives. With its capacity and experience, Delphi will provide a Local Reentry Coordinator and case managers to facilitate obtaining services for approximately 418 parole re-entry participants. Delphi will also obtain temporary housing for these participants as needed.

A request for qualifications was issued, and Delphi Drug and Alcohol Council, Inc. was rated the most qualified to provide this service.

**The specific legislative actions required are:**

1. Authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to accept a \$795,720 grant from, and to execute a contract and any amendments thereto with, the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services for the County Reentry Task Force Program for the period of October 1, 2024 through September 30, 2025.

2. Amend the 2024 operating budget of the Department of Public Safety, Office of Probation and Community Corrections, by appropriating the sum of \$795,720 into general fund 9300, funds center 2403010000, Probation/Community Corrections Administration.
3. Authorize the County Executive, or his designee, to execute a contract, and any amendments thereto, with Delphi Drug and Alcohol Council, Inc., 835 West Main Street, Rochester, New York 14611, for coordination and provision of the County Reentry Task Force services in the amount of \$784,500 for the period of October 1, 2024 through September 30, 2025.
4. Authorize the County Executive to appropriate any subsequent years of the grant award in accordance with the grant terms, to reappropriate any unencumbered balances during the grant period according to the grantor requirements, to make any necessary funding modifications within the grant guidelines to meet contractual commitments, and to enter into any amendments to extend the time period of the grant.
5. Should funding of this program be modified or terminated for any reason, the County Executive is hereby authorized to terminate or modify the program and, where applicable, to terminate or abolish some or all positions funded under such program. Any termination or abolishment of positions shall be in accordance with New York State Civil Service Law and, when applicable, the terms of any labor agreement affecting such positions.

This action is a Type II Action pursuant to 6 NYCRR § 617.5(c)(26) ("routine or continuing agency administration and management, not included new programs or major reordering of priorities that may affect the environment") and is not subject to further review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act.

This grant is 100% funded by the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services. No net County support is required in the current Monroe County budget.

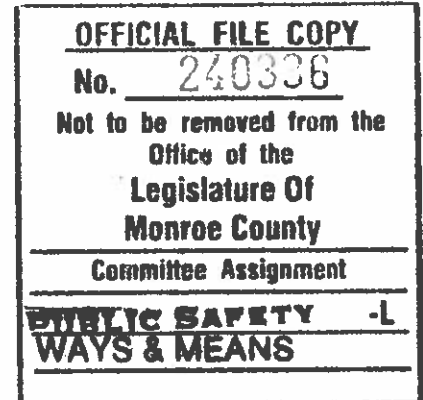

Honorable Legislators:

This matter is being referred to Your Honorable Body at the request of Sheriff Todd K. Baxter.

I recommend that Your Honorable Body amend Resolution 79 of 2023 to extend the time period of the grant from the New York State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services for the FY2022 Domestic Terrorism Prevention Grant Program through August 31, 2025; amend Resolution 233 of 2023 to increase the contract with Squad 9, LLC for Rochester Threat Advisory Committee planning and training consulting services from the amount of \$60,000 to the amount of \$70,000; and to extend the contract by one year through August 31, 2025, with all other terms to remain the same.

Squad 9, LLC provides strategic guidance on functional group inclusion to represent pertinent community stakeholders, update current emergency plans with TAM/ROCTA, produce and host training operation (regional if needed), and conduct related TAM exercises. The Monroe County Sheriff's Office has requested and been granted a no-cost time extension to the grant to allow for the completion of these services.

Subject: Amend Resolution 324 of 2023 Authorize a Contract with the North American Family Institute for the Youth and Police Engagement Program

Honorable Legislators:

I recommend that Your Honorable Body amend Resolution 324 of 2023 to amend a contract with the North American Family Institute ("NAFI") in an amount not to exceed \$198,000 for a youth and police engagement program for the period of January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2026.

Your Honorable Body approved the Monroe County Department of Public Safety's Youth and Police Engagement Program as part of the County's American Rescue Plan Act ("ARPA") funding under Resolution No. 342 of 2022. The goal of the program is to create positive change and improve the relationships between police departments, youth, and other law enforcement representatives. Ultimately, these improved relationships will increase trust between the community and law enforcement and help to mitigate a youth's involvement in the justice system. In addition, the program will develop youth leadership and advocacy skills while fostering a positive relationship between youth and the law enforcement officers that work in their communities.

Your Honorable Body further authorized the contract with NAFI pursuant to Resolution No. 324 of 2023. NAFI works with officers and teenagers from mainstream and alternative public schools, neighborhood organizations, probation departments, youth development programs, and housing developments with documented success. Its program has been implemented in many cities across the United States, including communities in downstate New York. The youth and police model offers training, train-the-trainer model services, coaching, curriculum, and materials to participating agencies.

Amending Resolution No. 324 of 2023 to authorize a three-year term of the contract, from January 1, 2024, through December 31, 2026, is necessary to meet ARPA requirements that all ARPA funding be obligated by December 31, 2024. Resolution No. 324 of 2023 originally authorized a one-year term in the amount not to exceed \$90,000, with the option of two one-year renewals in an amount not to exceed \$90,000 in the second year and \$18,000 in the third year.

**The specific legislative action required is to amend Resolution 324 of 2023 to amend a contract with the North American Family Institute, 90 Maple Street Unit 2, Stoneham, Massachusetts 02180, for a youth and police engagement program in an amount not to exceed \$198,000 for the period of January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2026.**

This is a Type II action pursuant to 6 NYCRR § 617.5(c)(26) ("routine or continuing agency administration and management, not including new programs or major reordering of priorities that may affect the environment") and is not subject to further review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act.

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Funding for this agreement is included in the 2024 operating budget of the Department of Public Safety, general fund 9301, funds center 2403020100 Juvenile Services Family Division, and will be requested in future years' budgets. No additional net County support is required in the current Monroe County budget.

NAFI is a not-for-profit agency and the records in the Office of the Monroe County Treasury have indicated that it does not owe any delinquent Monroe County property taxes.
